

I. Call Meeting to Order

Mayor Mitchell called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Mayor Mitchell asked the city secretary to call roll.

Present were: Mayor Mitchell, Mayor Pro Tem Ellison, Council Member Scheel, Council Member Rizo, Council Member Villalobos, Council Member Koch, and Council Member Tenorio. A quorum was present.

III. Citizen Comment Period with City Council

Mayor Mitchell brought forward citizen comments out of order. He opened citizen comments at 7:05 p.m.

Lisa Trahan was called to speak as registered. She thanked Mayor Mitchell and Mayor Pro Tem Ellison for their work on the development plans concerning the property of the 1200 to 1600 block of Rebel Drive. She mentioned that her daughter asked her to speak about the Woodpecker they spotted while walking recently in the area. She spoke about the different species of birds that habitat the area. Ms. Trahan said that she was speaking primarily for the wildlife in the area. She said that she knew Council cared about preserving the critical natural needs of Kyle and the

balance of needs of housing in their growing community. She thanked the Council for their service.

Mark Rhemann was called to speak as registered in favor of Item No. 23. He spoke about the traffic from 6:30 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. Mr. Rhemann spoke about retail property in front of his neighborhood that has been sitting there for four years with no development. He said another retail property going in later down the road would leave the space undeveloped. He stated that he knew the Council did not control the road, but he would prefer residential over retail.

Peter Parcher was called to speak as registered. He congratulated Mr. Rizo on his re-election and thanked Council Member Tenorio for everything she has done. Mr. Parcher said he was there to address Mayor Mitchell directly regarding a statement that he said Mayor Mitchell made regarding a petition. There was no response by Mayor Mitchell.

Sandra O'Neal was called to speak as registered in opposition of Item No. 23. She spoke about the Brooks property and stated that she believes the Brooks family would rather see more preservation of the wildlife. She said that residential would suit the area so much better than retail and mentioned not being happy if retail space was put in. She talked about the road noise and future road widening, pleading to Council to consider area residential only. She mentioned their consideration going far with citizens.

Tracy Gerrish was called to speak as registered in opposition of Item No. 23. She said that she has lived in Kyle for 16 years. She spoke about moving here from Austin and said it had turned into a concrete jungle with few green spaces. Ms. Gerrish mentioned reasons for moving to Kyle were that she could see the stars at night and still see green trees and had a hometown feel. She talked about putting commercial properties in residential areas that were taking away from the hometown feeling. She mentioned retail/residential being unaffordable. She said that she would not like concrete, lights, and a box store near residential area.

Mayor Mitchell said Rick Hannah wanted to speak on an item but the item concerning Brooks Crossing has postponed until December 3rd, due to work on a development agreement to accommodate concerns brought up by the residents. Rick Hannah with Blackburn Group spoke about the development of the area. He stated that he is in the process of working out a development agreement. He is aware of the petition circulating about the area. He stated that they are listening, they are preserving a tremendous amount of green space. He spoke about a 10-foot buffer between their development and the Plum Creek development. He said, they intend to keep that buffer, as well as R-1-3 and R-1-2. Even R-1-1. Overall density in line with R-1-2.

Council Member Tenorio moved to direct staff to work with Ned Davenport to bring forward a development agreement that staff has vetted and is in support. Council Member Scheel seconded the motion.

There was discussion on the motion. Council Member Villalobos mentioned that he would like to see a diagram of surrounding properties that are under development in the area. Mayor Mitchell asked for clarification on annexing when the use changes versus annexing once building is complete. Mayor Mitchell spoke about Stormwater runoff, building standards, setback rules, project, and exceptions for. He said his thoughts were that, if they offered an exception to allow to build to county standards and exempt the development agreement he was a part of from the Ordinance, that it takes the city out of the equation as far as contribution to what kind of project he put in. Mayor Mitchell said he was not saying he was for or against and mentioned he was interested to see staff analysis as it relates to what I am referring to here on development standards and stormwater runoff. Mr. Sellers added, water and wastewater requirements to the items Mayor Mitchell mentioned. Mr. Davenport said Wastewater isn't there yet, so they are talking septic. Council Member Rizo talked briefly about an updated map for the 150 alignment.

He mentioned next steps after zoning if approved would be design and engineering.

With no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Mitchell closed the public hearing at 8:17 p.m.

Mr. Koontz continued his presentation.

Council Member Tenorio moved to approve an ordinance amending Chapter 53 (Zoning) based on staff recommendation. Council Member Villalobos seconded the motion.

There was discussion on the motion. Mr. Sellers spoke about Bunton Lane Adjacent Line Mile Fee. Council Member Tenorio stated that the roads do not get finished as quickly as the development. Mayor Mitchell said he did not like any of the three options. He mentioned land use and development patterns. He said it was very strange to have these random zoning blocks, an echo of old plans and will have a major development implication. He said his preference is for the applicant to engage staff in a development agreement. He stated, to Council Member Tenorio's point, there is quite a lot of traffic in the area already. He mentioned, as with previous applicants Council has tried hard to make sure it goes forward as long as it takes into consideration in a meaningful way, several controls and measures in place for that to happen, straight zoning. He said, since then, the company had been acquired by Hilltop Securities, which is a national firm as well. He continued that with the population being under 50,000, the City does not attract a national firm. He stated that the City has had a long relationship with Chris Allen who was employed by First Southwest Financial, and he has made himself available literally 24/7. Mr. Moheet said since 2013 he has helped the city save \$8,500,000.00 million and \$5,000,000.00 of that is from savings by refunding and timing the market. The rest of the difference he said, was from selling at premium. He spoke about Chris Allen being a senior level employee who is now with RBC Capital Markets LLC and what he has brought to the City of Kyle. Council Member Scheel stated that in order to keep Mr. Allen the City needs to select RBC. Mr. Moheet stated with the approval of the agreement is also direction to give 30 days' notice to Hilltop Securities. Mayor Pro Tem Ellison expressed his appreciation to Mr. Moheet for the presentation. Chris Allen spoke to explain selling premium bonds. The yields are low, investors want to see a higher coupon, so they pay more for bonds. premiums, our credit rating, investors willing to pay more upfront than having longer term maturities. He said, they're willing to give you \$105.00 dollars for a \$100.00 bond because they make money on coupons on the short term rather than waiting on maturities over 20 or 25 years. 

I. Call Meeting to Order

Mayor Mitchell called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Mayor Mitchell asked the city secretary to call roll. Present were: Mayor Mitchell, Mayor Pro Tem Ellison, Council Member Scheel, Council Member Rizo, Council Member Villalobos, Council Member Koch, and Council Member Tenorio. A quorum was present.

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III. Citizen Comment Period with City Council

Mayor Mitchell opened citizen comments at 7:05 p.m.

Mark Trahan was called to speak as registered in opposition of Item No. 21. He spoke about nature and its effect on stress, cognitive development, and relationships. He stated that children who grow up in more green spaces have less mental illness. He stated that leafy trees stave off depression in adults and even teenagers. He continued that additionally, tree canopies are found to provide 30% more positive health outcomes. He stated the developer will be long gone in 20 years when the development has matured and asked the Council to fight for every tree, for the public health.

Lisa Trahan was called to speak as registered regarding Item No. 21. She stated that she has lived in her home on Mather for 4 years and her priority is the birds. She was concerned about the loss of natural beauty and inherent privacy. She is more concerned about the birds. She would like to see Kyle maintain its natural beauty, specifically the trees and the birds. In the developer agreement she would like to see the proposals they developed as a family, that gained support of the neighbors, incorporated into the developer agreement. She said, most importantly retention of the oak trees and natural brush barrier. Ms. Trahan thanked Rick Hanna for speaking at the last meeting. She respectfully requests Council make use of a developer agreement.

Rick Hanna was called to speak as registered in favor of Item No. 21 and 22. He provided an update that they are currently in the process of creating a development agreement taking into consideration the ideas of the neighbors. He stated they are looking at 138 homes on 47 acres and that it was 2.9 units per acre and in line with R1-1 zoning as far as density is concerned. Oak trees will be used for amenity areas and community area where the mail kiosk will be. Again, he has overlaid the tree survey, over 90% of the trees will be preserved. The density proposed is in line with much more restrictive zoning. He hopes there will be something proposed at the next Council Meeting.

David Douglas was called to speak as registered. He stated that he was here for the September meeting where he provided 50 photos of blighted areas and sludge along Stagecoach Road, Center Street, and Rebel Road. He stated that driving to this meeting, nothing has been done. Utility Companies have not been held responsible for cleaning up their mess. He mentioned if Burleson Street is not cleaned up that the investment would be for naught. He would like to follow up. He mentioned that he always must follow up with the City, the City has rarely followed up with him. He talked about suspension of utility rates for people out of town for extended periods of time. He said, Council Member Villalobos has been in touch and he said that would be taken under consideration. Mr. Douglas said the Finance Director stated the system is not set up for that. He spoke of his vacation home in Florida, for which 20 weeks of the year they will not receive services for trash and recycling. He also spoke about a need for an ordinance to stop vehicles from soiling the streets. There is nothing code enforcement can do. He has not seen anything come forward. He thanked Council for their time.



Second, we'd like to recognize the partnership that it takes to advocate and support survivors of child abuse and sexual assault: San Marcos Police Department, Buda Police Department, Kyle Police Department, Texas State University, Hays County Sheriff's Office, Hays County Child protective services, HCWC (Hays-Caldwell Women's Center along with Roxanne's House, our children's advocacy center), CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates), Greater San Marcos Youth Council, CTMC and Hays County District Attorney's Office.

In 2018, there were 455 confirmed child abuse cases in Hays County. Last year, 397 victims of child abuse received services at Roxanne's House from Hays County. Also, HCWC served 230 local victims of sexual assault in Hays and Caldwell counties last year.

We as a community are allied in the fight against child abuse and sexual assault - especially through this crisis. We know that keeping people in homes is for their safety from this virus but would be remiss to say that their being home also increases their risk for escalated violence with many losing jobs, access to other support resources, child care needs, working from home – all could exacerbate already fragile home lives.

The silver lining is that we ARE a community and a community that has come together time and again. We are all still here to help. Our first responders from law enforcement to child protective services to local hospitals and social services alike will never stop answering the call to help. HCWC's emergency services from shelter, hospital response, emergency child forensic interviews, crisis calls, emergency protective orders – all of this is still available to those in immediate need. We are all part of the response and together, we will make it through this. Our shared goal of a healthy and safe community will remain united. Thank you for being a part of this.

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT ESTABLISHES RESTRICTIONS UPON THE UNNECESSARY DISTRIBUTION OF PRINTED MATERIALS

WHEREAS, it is the city's intent to reduce litter throughout the city; and

WHEREAS, Kyle strives to protect its citizens' private property; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance will increase compliance with MS4 program requirements to protect our waterways and drainage ways from excess litter and debris.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. Article IX, Stormwater Regulations, Section 50-406(c) is hereby added to Chapter 50 "Utilities" of the Code of Ordinances, and is hereby amended to read and be as follows:

Section 50-406. – Prohibitions.

- (c) Prohibit the placement of certain printed materials
 - (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to distribute, or cause to be distributed, within the city any handbill, phone book, advertisement or printed or written material by placing, or causing such handbill or printed or written material to be placed in any yards, driveways, walkways or porches of any structure within the city.
 - (2) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any newspaper, or to any publication containing printed or written material, to which the occupants of the subject premises pay money (United States currency) in return for receiving such material.
 - (3) This section is not intended, nor shall it be construed to prohibit distribution of printed or written material utilizing any means of distribution which does not cause such materials to be placed or deposited in any yards, driveways, walkways or porches of any structure within the city which means of distribution shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:
 - a. The U.S. mail;
 - b. Personally, handing such material to persons willing to accept the same on streets, sidewalks, parks or at their residences;
 - c. Political and religious material; or
 - d. Utilizing doorknobs or mailbox hanging devices in a manner which reasonably ensures that such material shall not be placed or caused to become placed or deposited upon any yards, driveways or porches of any structure within the city.

- (d) Allowable discharges.
 - (1) A discharge authorized by, and in full compliance with, a TPDES permit;
 - (2) A discharge or flow resulting from firefighting by the fire department;
 - (3) A discharge or flow of fire protection water that does not contain oil or hazardous substances;
 - (4) Agricultural stormwater runoff;
 - (5) A discharge or flow from water line flushing, but not including a discharge from water line disinfection by super chlorination or other means unless the total residual chlorine (TRC) has been reduced to less than 1.0 mg/l and it contains no harmful quantity of chlorine or any other chemical used in line disinfection;
 - (6) A discharge or flow from lawn watering, or landscape irrigation, or other irrigation water;
 - (7) A discharge or flow from a diverted stream or natural spring;
 - (8) A discharge or flow from uncontaminated pumped groundwater or rising groundwater;
 - (9) Uncontaminated groundwater infiltration (as defined as 40 CFR 35.2005(20)) to the MS4:
 - (10) Uncontaminated discharge or flow from a foundation drain, crawl space pump, footing drain, or sump pump;
 - (11) A discharge or flow from a potable water source not containing any harmful substance or material from the cleaning or draining of a storage tank or other container;
 - (12) A discharge or flow from air conditioning condensation that is unmixed with water from a cooling tower, emissions scrubber, emissions filter, or any other source of pollutant;
 - (13) A discharge or flow from individual residential car washing;
 - (14) A discharge or flow from water used in street washing that is not contaminated with any soap, detergent, degreaser, solvent, emulsifier, dispersant, or any other harmful cleaning substance;
 - (15) Stormwater runoff from a roof that is not contaminated by any runoff or discharge from an emissions scrubber or filter or any other source of pollutant;
 - (16) Swimming pool water that has been dechlorinated so that total residual chlorine (TRC) is less than 1.0 mg/l and that contains no harmful quantity of chlorine, muriatic acid or other chemical used in the treatment or disinfection of the swimming pool water or in pool cleaning.

Section 2. Violations and Penalty

Violations of this section shall be punishable as stated in Sec. 50-418. - Penalties.

Firms shall provide all information simply and economically as required by this RFQ. Failure to provide this information may result in rejection of the proposal. Qualifications shall provide a straightforward, concise description of the respondent's ability to meet the requirements. Emphasis shall be on quality, completeness, clarity of content, responsiveness to the requirements, and understanding of City's needs. The City requests the submittal be limited to ten (10) sheets front and back (20 sides), excluding resumes and cover letter/transmittal letter. A copy of current certificate of insurance for professional liability.

1. BACKGROUND

The City of Kyle owns, operates, and maintains an existing wastewater treatment plant (WWTP), which consists of two separate plants, each permitted for a design flow rate of 1.50 MGD and a 2-hour peak flow of 6.0 MGD. Plant 1 was constructed in 2000 and Plant 2 was completed in 2006. Treatment is achieved by aerobic wastewater treatment, clarification, and disinfection prior to discharge of treated effluent into Plum Creek. Both existing plants shall be modified as a function of the construction of the plant expansion. For the expanded wastewater treatment plant, influent wastewater will be screened and pumped prior to being biologically treated in an anerobic and aerobic basins, separating the solids from the treated wastewater in clarifiers, and disinfecting and aerating the filtered effluent prior to discharge into Plum Creek. Waste solids generated by the existing and expanded treatment facilities will be aerobically digested dewatered and disposed off-site through a contracted service provider.

2. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of this RFQ is to select and contract with the most qualified firm to provide construction management and integrated inspection services to include full-time daily onsite inspection, schedule updates, reporting of construction activities, progress payments, attend progress meetings, and facility commissioning. The goal of the construction management and related inspection services is to achieve the following:

- 1. Act as an agent of the City of Kyle and shall be responsible to assure that all work is accomplished in accordance with the project plans, specifications, City of Kyle standards and details, in a manner that meets the objectives described.
- 2. Apply and integrate comprehensive project controls to manage the critical issues of schedule and budget.
- 3. Ensure quality construction in accordance with the plans and specifications.
- 4. Assist in establishing and possible maintaining a Project Management Information System (PMIS).
- 5. Communicate /coordinate the safety and security requirements at the job site.

The Construction Management services must be provided by an independent party that is not involved in the planning, design or construction of the Wastewater Plant Expansion.

At a minimum, each project team during construction shall consist of a Construction Manager (CM), Construction Inspector (CI), and Mechanical, Electrical, and Instrumentation support.

During construction, the Inspector shall maintain an on-site presence while work is in progress.

A construction management contract will be awarded to the selected firm for the phases of work planned at the Kyle Wastewater Treatment Plant. The contract duration is planned for 24-months.

The Construction Manager and Construction Inspection may be the same qualified individual.

3. CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT TEAM REQUIREMENTS:

- In-depth knowledge of standard construction specifications, codes and special standards, methods, materials and equipment used in construction of water and wastewater facilities
- Working knowledge of methods of soil compaction and density testing procedures, properties and uses of concrete, and techniques of handling, placing, curing and sampling concrete
- Experience with water and wastewater treatment plant start-up and commissioning.
- Thorough knowledge of materials testing as applicable to water and wastewater facilities.
- In-depth understanding of OSHA Construction Safety Standards
- Minimum of 10 years of construction experience including water and wastewater plants, pipelines, and pumping facilities
- Completion of OSHA 10-hour safety course and other related construction safety training by all onsite personnel (provide certifications for all onsite personnel).

Preference will be given to the firm which has demonstrated capabilities in successfully completing projects of similar scope and complexity and routinely exceed expectations in terms of wastewater treatment facilities construction, project delivery and safety.

GENERAL SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUESTED

Construction Manager (CM)

The Construction Manager (CM) shall monitor the work of the construction contractor and report to City of Kyle Project Manager. The construction manager shall provide construction management and execution of the construction project as set forth in the plans and specifications.

The CM may perform the following duties:

- The CM will coordinate the Inspector for the project
- The CM will monitor monthly the Contractor's actual progress relative to the planned construction schedule
- The CM will coordinate with the City Project Manager to assist in the preparation of meeting agenda, minutes for pre-construction and construction meetings
- The CM will assist in the review and coordination of recommended action on identified field changes of conditions
- The CM will assist in the coordination of the review of RFI's
- The CM will assist in the management, receipt, distribution and return of shop drawings
- The CM will review the draft payment request for completeness and recommend Project Manager action on contract progress payments
- The CM will review field As Built drawings as needed throughout construction, and coordinate submission to Engineer of Record
- The CM will set up, coordinate, and distribute documents for Substantial completion
- The CM will review list of deficiencies identified by CI and recommended contractor corrective actions
- The CM will review and assist with project closeout documents for project completion

Construction Inspector (CI)

The Construction Inspector (CI) shall observe the work of the construction contractor and report to the CM. City of Kyle Project Manager and CI shall provide observation of the work for conformance with the plans and specifications. However, the CI neither guarantees the performance of the contractor nor assumes responsibility for the contractor's failure to perform work in accordance with the contract documents.

The CI can perform the following duties:

- The CI will create daily construction reports for the project, including monitoring and documenting the observed work in the field activity for each day
- The CI will monitor daily the Contractor's actual progress relative to his planned construction schedule

- The CI will attend preconstruction and construction progress meetings
- The CI will help coordinate and advise on field conditions for field changes
- The CI will review the draft payment request for delivery of materials, and quantities completed and recommend to CM and Project Manager action on contract progress payments
- The CI will redline mark up the construction drawings in accordance with the information furnished by the Contractor reflecting changes to the project made during construction and delivery to the CM, Project Manager and Design Engineer
- The CI will coordinate the work of testing laboratories and observation bureaus required for the testing or observation of materials, witnessed test, etc., for quality assurance
- The CI will inspect materials delivered to the site for defects, quantities, and contract compliance
- The CI will conduct, in the company of the Project Manager, CM and Design Engineer a substantial completion review of the project for conformance with the design concept of the project, general compliance with the contract documents
- The CI will provide a list of deficiencies to the contractor, CM and Project Manager
- The CI will observe with the Contractor for the startup and testing of equipment and piping, and instrumentation and electrical systems as specified per the contract documents
- The CI will conduct, in the company of the Project Manager, CM and Design Engineer a final review of the project for conformance with the design concept of the project and general compliance with the contract documents, verify that items identified on the deficiency list from the substantial completion review have been completed, and make recommendation for final payment to the contractor
- The CI will coordinate with the City of Kyle Plant Staff on operations shutdowns or interruptions of service for the site

SELECTION PROCESS

The review committee will be selected by the City Engineer. The committee will analyze and evaluate the submittals. Firms shall completely respond to all components of this RFQ or firm will not be considered. Interviews may be conducted as deemed necessary by City staff.

By submitting a response to this RFQ, firm accepts the evaluation process as outlined in the following section and acknowledges and accepts the determination of the "most qualified" firm may require subjective judgments by the City.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBMITTAL

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AN ORDINANCE MAKING FINDINGS OF FACT; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ACQUISITION OF 0.403 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, FOR A PERMANENT WASTEWATER EASEMENT, IN ADDITION TO THE ACQUISITION OF 0.240 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, FOR A WATERLINE EASEMENT OUT PERMANENT OF **SEPARATE** ECONOMIC UNIT OF 3.500 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, OUT OF A 9.250 ACRE TRACT OF LAND ("TRACT 21"), MORE OR LESS, LOCATED IN HAYS COUNTY, TEXAS, AND OWNED BY ALEXANDER FAMILY TRUST AND BJ-MJ ALEXANDER, LTD, MORE FULLY DESCRIBED BY METES AND BOUNDS IN EXHIBIT "A" TO THIS ORDINANCE AND REQUIRED FOR THE COMPLETION OF THE CONSTRUCTION, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE MUNICIPAL WATER AND WASTEWATER FACILITIES KNOWN AS BOTH THE SOUTHSIDE WASTEWATER IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND THE BLANCO BASIN WATER AND WASTEWATER LINE PROJECT: FINDING THE ACQUISITION OF THE PROPERTY IS REQUIRED AND NECESSARY FOR A BONA FIDE PUBLIC USE AND THE PUBLIC'S SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE IS ADVANCED BY SUCH ACQUISITION; FINDING THAT THE CITY HAS COMPLIED WITH ALL PRE-ACQUISITION REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN CHAPTER 21, TEXAS **PROPERTY** CODE: **CONFIRMING** AND **RATIFYING** AUTHORIZATIONS, ACTIONS, AND GOOD FAITH NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS **PROPERTY** CODE: **AUTHORIZING** AND DIRECTING PERSONNEL TO TAKE SUCH ACTIONS AS ARE NECESSARY TO EXERCISE THE CITY'S POWER OF EMINENT DOMAIN AND ACQUIRE THE EASEMENTS ON, OVER, THROUGH, AND ACROSS THE TRACT OF LAND IN A CONDEMNATION ACTION AND TO TAKE ALL OTHER NECESSARY STEPS TO OBTAIN SUCH LANDS.

Whereas, the City of Kyle, Texas, a home rule municipal corporation (the "City") that provides water and other utility services to the City and the area within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City; and

Whereas, the City is authorized pursuant to Section 1.06, Kyle Home Rule Charter, by and through the procedures outlined in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, to exercise the power of eminent domain for any public purpose or as necessary or desirable to carry out any power conferred by the Charter or state or federal law; and

Whereas, the City is explicitly authorized pursuant to Section 251.001, Texas Local Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for various enumerated public uses; and

Whereas, the City is explicitly authorized pursuant to Section 2206.001(c), Texas

Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for water supply, wastewater, flood control, and drainage projects, as well as the provision of utility services, among other enumerated items; and

Whereas, the City Council has determined that 0.403 acres, more or less, of land for a wastewater easement and 0.240 acres, more or less, of land for a water easement is appropriate, reasonable and necessary to acquire for a public utility on, over, through and across a separate economic unit of 3.5 acres, more or less, out of the tract of land ("Tract 21") more specifically described by metes and bounds, which is attached hereto (the "Property"), for the purposes of construction, operation, and maintenance of the Blanco Basin Water and Wastewater Line Project and the Southside Wastewater Improvement Project (the "Project"); and

Whereas, the City Council recognizes the need to acquire the Property for the Project and acknowledges that acquisition of the Property is for a bona fide public use as defined by Section 251.001(a)(4), Texas Local Government Code, and is reasonable and necessary for the public health, safety and welfare to serve and benefit the public, citizens of the City and its water customers with water services; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that no reasonable, feasible or prudent alternatives exist but to acquire and take the Property for the Project; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that the City has attempted and will continue, in good faith, to negotiate with The Alexander Family Trust, by and through Mary Jane Alexander as Trustee and Mary Jane Alexander as the Director of Mary Jane Alexander GP, the general partner of BJ -MJ Alexander, LTD. (the "Landowner"), directly and through their attorneys, by complying with all pre-acquisition requirements set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, including, but not limited to, making an initial offer, providing the Landowner's Bill of Rights, a copy of the appraisal performed on behalf of the City regarding the Property, and a bona fide final offer; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that the Landowner has rejected the City's bona fide final offer and/or the requisite time set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code has elapsed, permitting the City to authorize the institution of eminent domain proceedings against the Landowner; and

Whereas, it is essential to the public health and safety that the City acquire the required Property as soon as possible and begin construction of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Findings of Fact. The above and foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein as findings of fact. The City Council further finds and determines that the immediate acquisition of the Property, as more specifically described in the following Section 2, is a bona fide public use and essential to the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City; and that all actions required and necessary to acquire such Property for the Project and the related improvements, should be pursued, accomplished and completed immediately.

<u>Section 2. Property To Be Acquired.</u> The following described Property is necessary and essential to the health and public safety of the citizens of the City and the function, performance and operation of a portion of the City's water system:

- (1) A 0.403 acre tract, more or less, for a wastewater line easement for the purposes of construction, reconstruction, operation, and maintenance of the municipal wastewater line, as well as a 0.240 acre tract, more or less, for a water easement for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, operation and maintenance of the municipal water line, on, over, through and across a separate economic unit of 3.5 acres, more or less, from that 9.25 acre, more or less, tract of land ("Tract 21") which is part of the John Jones Survey, Abstract 263, Hays County, Texas as more particularly described by metes and bounds and shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully transcribed herein.
- Section 3. Acquisition and Negotiation Authorized. The City Manager, the City Attorney and other designated staff are hereby authorized to acquire the Property through the institution of eminent domain proceedings, as set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, and are directed to initiate and complete all other actions deemed necessary and appropriate to obtain the Property. The City Manager and City Attorney are hereby further authorized to continue good faith negotiations with the Landowner of such Property for the acquisition of the same.
- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Ratification of Actions.</u> All actions heretofore taken by the City Council, the Mayor, city staff, the City Manager, and the City Attorney with respect to the acquisition of the Property described in Section 2 above and the establishment of the Project, including the negotiation for and/or acquisition of any necessary property rights, are hereby confirmed, ratified, approved and adopted by the Council.
- <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Further Procedures.</u> The City Manager and the City Attorney are hereby expressly authorized, empowered and directed, from time to time, to do and perform all such acts and things as may be reasonable, necessary and desirable in order to acquire the Property on terms and conditions that are in the best interest of the public, and that provide the Landowner of the Property lawful, just and reasonable compensation.

Whereas, the City of Kyle, Texas, a home rule municipal corporation (the "City") that provides water and other utility services to the City and the area within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City; and

Whereas, the City is authorized pursuant to Section 1.06, Kyle Home Rule Charter, by and through the procedures outlined in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, to exercise the power of eminent domain for any public purpose or as necessary or desirable to carry out any power conferred by the Charter or state or federal law; and

Whereas, the City is explicitly authorized pursuant to Section 251.001, Texas Local Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for various enumerated public uses; and

Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for water supply, wastewater, flood control, and drainage projects, as well as the provision of utility services, among other enumerated items; and

Whereas, the City Council has determined that 0.20 acres, more or less, of land for a wastewater easement and 0.12 acres, more or less, of land for a water easement is appropriate, reasonable and necessary to acquire for a public utility on, over, through and across a separate economic unit of 3.0 acres, more or less, out of the tract of land ("Tract 22") more specifically described by metes and bounds, which is attached hereto (the "Property"), for the purposes of construction, operation, and maintenance of the Blanco Basin Water and Wastewater Line Project and the Southside Wastewater Improvement Project (the "Project"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. Findings of Fact. The above and foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein as findings of fact. 



Whereas, the City of Kyle, Texas, a home rule municipal corporation (the "City") that provides water and other utility services to the City and the area within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City; and

Whereas, the City is authorized pursuant to Section 1.06, Kyle Home Rule Charter, by and through the procedures outlined in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, to exercise the power of eminent domain for any public purpose or as necessary or desirable to carry out any power conferred by the Charter or state or federal law; and

Whereas, the City is explicitly authorized pursuant to Section 251.001, Texas Local Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for various enumerated public uses; and

Whereas, the City is explicitly authorized pursuant to Section 2206.001(c), Texas

Government Code, to take private property through the use of eminent domain for water supply, wastewater, flood control, and drainage projects, as well as the provision of utility services, among other enumerated items; and

Whereas, the City Council has determined that 0.475 acres, more or less, of land for a wastewater easement and 0.285 acres, more or less, of land for a water easement is appropriate, reasonable and necessary to acquire for a public utility on, over, through and across a separate economic unit of 6.0 acres, more or less, out of the tract of land ("Tract 23") more specifically described by metes and bounds, which is attached hereto (the "Property"), for the purposes of construction, operation, and maintenance of the Blanco Basin Water and Wastewater Line Project and the Southside Wastewater Improvement Project (the "Project"); and

Whereas, the City Council recognizes the need to acquire the Property for the Project and acknowledges that acquisition of the Property is for a bona fide public use as defined by Section 251.001(a)(4), Texas Local Government Code, and is reasonable and necessary for the public health, safety and welfare to serve and benefit the public, citizens of the City and its water customers with water services; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that no reasonable, feasible or prudent alternatives exist but to acquire and take the Property for the Project; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that the City has attempted and will continue, in good faith, to negotiate with The Alexander Family Trust, by and through Mary Jane Alexander as Trustee and Mary Jane Alexander as the Director of Mary Jane Alexander GP, the general partner of BJ -MJ Alexander, LTD. (the "Landowner"), directly and through their attorneys, by complying with all pre-acquisition requirements set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, including, but not limited to, making an initial offer, providing the Landowner's Bill of Rights, a copy of the appraisal performed on behalf of the City regarding the Property, and a bona fide final offer; and

Whereas, the City Council finds that the Landowner has rejected the City's bona fide final offer and/or the requisite time set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code has elapsed, permitting the City to authorize the institution of eminent domain proceedings against the Landowner; and

Whereas, it is essential to the public health and safety that the City acquire the required Property as soon as possible and begin construction of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Findings of Fact. The above and foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein as findings of fact. The City Council further finds and determines that the immediate acquisition of the Property, as more specifically described in the following Section 2, is a bona fide public use and essential to the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City; and that all actions required and necessary to acquire such Property for the Project and the related improvements, should be pursued, accomplished and completed immediately.

<u>Section 2. Property To Be Acquired.</u> The following described Property is necessary and essential to the health and public safety of the citizens of the City and the function, performance and operation of a portion of the City's water system:

- (1) A 0.475 acre tract, more or less, for a wastewater line easement for the purposes of construction, reconstruction, operation, and maintenance of the municipal wastewater line, as well as a 0.285 acre tract, more or less, for a water easement for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, operation and maintenance of the municipal water line, on, over, through and across a separate economic unit of 6.0 acres, more or less, from that 23.700 acre, more or less, tract of land ("Tract 23") which is part of the John Jones Survey, Abstract 263, Hays County, Texas as more particularly described by metes and bounds and shown in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully transcribed herein.
- Section 3. Acquisition and Negotiation Authorized. The City Manager, the City Attorney and other designated staff are hereby authorized to acquire the Property through the institution of eminent domain proceedings, as set forth in Chapter 21, Texas Property Code, and are directed to initiate and complete all other actions deemed necessary and appropriate to obtain the Property. The City Manager and City Attorney are hereby further authorized to continue good faith negotiations with the Landowner of such Property for the acquisition of the same.
- <u>Section 4.</u> <u>Ratification of Actions.</u> All actions heretofore taken by the City Council, the Mayor, city staff, the City Manager, and the City Attorney with respect to the acquisition of the Property described in Section 2 above and the establishment of the Project, including the negotiation for and/or acquisition of any necessary property rights, are hereby confirmed, ratified, approved and adopted by the Council.
- <u>Section 6.</u> <u>Further Procedures.</u> The City Manager and the City Attorney are hereby expressly authorized, empowered and directed, from time to time, to do and perform all such acts and things as may be reasonable, necessary and desirable in order to acquire the Property on terms and conditions that are in the best interest of the public, and that provide the Landowner of the Property lawful, just and reasonable compensation.







SECOND AMENDED DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

BETWEEN CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS AND CLAYTON PROPERTIES GROUP, INC. DBA BROHN HOMES

This amended Development Agreement ("Second Amended Agreement") is by and between the City of Kyle, Texas, a home rule city situated in Hays County, Texas (the "City") and Clayton Properties Group, Inc. d/b/a Brohn Homes ("Developer"). The term "Parties" or "Party" means the City and the Developer collectively or singularly.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Developer is the owner of a parcel of real property (the "Property" or "Parcel") in Hays County, Texas, which is more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A";

WHEREAS, on May 5th, 2015, the City and the Lehman Family Trust, a former owner of the Property, entered into that one certain Amended and Restated Section 212.172 Texas Local Government Code Development Agreement recorded in the Official Public Records of Hays County, Texas ("Prior Agreement").

WHEREAS, on	the City and the	, entered into an amendment to that one
certain Amended Development	t Agreement recorded in the Of	ficial Public Records of Hays County,
Texas ("Amended Prior Agreer	ment") a copy of which is attac	hed as Exhibit " ";

WHEREAS, the Developer wishes to construct a detention/retention/wet pond for the management and discharge of storm water within the development titled the ______ pond in ______ of Casetta Ranch, a copy of a map of which is attached as Exhibit "" (the "Pond);

WHEREAS, the Developer wishes to employ the use of pumps (the "Pond Pumps") for the purpose of discharging stormwater from the Pond and the City is willing to allow the use of a pump in the Pond with the imposition of certain commitments and conditions set forth herein;

WHEREAS, the City and Developer desire to amend the Amended Prior Agreement to incorporate such commitments and conditions for the maintenance of the Pond;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to 9.06 of the Amended Prior Agreement and for and in consideration of the above stated recitals, which are made a part of this Agreement, the benefits described below, plus the mutual promises expressed herein, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the Parties, the Parties hereby contract, covenant and agree as follows:

- 1.01 Purpose. This Second Amended Agreement modifies and amends the Amended Prior Agreement only as set forth herein by the Parties, but not otherwise. In all other respects the Amended Prior Agreement is restated and affirmed.
- 1.02 Authority. Authority for Developer and the City to enter into this Second Amended Agreement exists under the City Charter of the City, Article III, Section 52-a of the Texas Constitution; Chapter 212, Subchapter G, Tex. Local Government Code, ("Subchapter G"), Chapter 395 of the Tex. Local Government Code; and such other statutes as may be applicable.
- 3.03 **Subdivision Infrastructure**. Is hereby amended by adding the following subparagraphs (d), (e), (f), and (g).
- (d) The Pond, as shown on the attached Exhibit "" containing pump(s) for the discharge of storm water, electrical systems for the functioning of the Pond Pumps and back-up electrical connections for the operation of the Pond Pump(s) in the event of an electrical failure, shall in all respects be owned, operated and maintained by the HOA properly established by the Developer and shall obligate the HOA to the following:
 - i) Enter into and maintain a contract with a properly licensed and bonded contractor for the operation and maintenance of the Pond (the "Pond Operator"), requiring at least the following obligations;
 - a) Maintaining a bi-annual log of the maintenance of the Pond and the Pond Pump(s).
 - b) Inspection of the condition and functionality of the Pond and Pond Pump(s).
 - c) Clear, remove rubbish and other refuse, mow the area of the Pond lot and specifically maintain the Pond to function as intended.
 - d) Prepare and deliver to the City not less frequently than annually, in the form acceptable to the City, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "__", a report on the maintenance of the Pond, the condition of the Pond Pump(s) and back-up electrical connections (the "Annual Report").
 - e) Provide for Wet well Pond Pump(s) and/or control panel to include SCADA (Supervisory Control And Data Acquisition), landline, cellular based auto-dialer or equivalent automated notification system. Automated notification shall include at a minimum when power is off (lost) and when Pump are on. Notification to be tested with Pond Operator prior to final walk through. City inspector is to be notified and present at testing.
 - ii) Provide the Annual Report to the City.
- (e) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein or in the Amended Prior Agreement, the HOA shall provide for the ability of the City to periodically access the Pond, Pond Pump(s), automated notification system, power supply, back-up power connections and maintenance log for proper operation and maintenance, with an authorized HOA representative present, if desired by the HOA.

- (f) The final plats for the subdivision shall contain a plat note in a form acceptable to the City that sets forth the obligation of the HOA to maintain the Pond and the Pond Pumps in accordance with this Second Amended Agreement.
- (g) The Developer shall establish bylaws, rules, regulations and restrictive covenants (collectively the "Association Regulations") to assure the HOA performs and accomplishes the duties and purposes required to be performed and accomplished by the HOA pursuant to subsection 3.03(d) (the "Maintenance Obligation"). The HOA's Maintenance Obligation shall be noted in the restrictive covenants filed of record for the subdivision. D Pipeline Ordinance Amendment

AMENDMENT TO AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS REGULATING CITY ROADS, RIGHTS OF WAY, EASEMENTS OR UTILITY INFRASTRUCTURE AND SUCH USE THEREOF BY PIPELINES; MAKING FINDINGS OF FACT; PROVIDING DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING A MAXIMUM PENALTY; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY AND OPEN MEETINGS CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING FOR RELATED MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kyle (the "City") recognizes the need to continue to regulate areas involving the City's roadways, rights of way, easements and utility infrastructure;

WHEREAS, the City is a home rule city with the requisite authority to protect the public health and welfare and it is in the public interest to have regulatory control over some aspects of pipeline installation to minimize conflicts with existing buildings, roadways (current and planned) and land uses together with future infrastructure and development;

WHEREAS, the City desires to improve the clarity and ensure consistency with both federal and state law provisions concerning pipelines;

WHEREAS, the City Council continues to understand the limits of its regulations and it is the City's intention to not engage in regulation or enforcement activity with respect to matters that are or may be within the exclusive jurisdiction of either the federal government or the State of Texas, including the United States Department of Transportation and the Texas Railroad Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to clarify the provisions herein and in agreements that any easement granted, any rights of way use agreements approved or any other form of permit granted under this ordinance or through agreement is singular as to the number of pipelines that may be placed in the rights of way, as well as the types of materials that may be transported in those pipelines that have been granted permits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KYLE, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. Findings of Fact. The above and foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are incorporated herein as findings of fact.

Section 2. <u>Building Regulations Amended</u>. The City Council hereby modifies and amends the previously adopted regulations and procedures as presently set forth in Exhibit "A" hereto entitled "Building Regulations and Permitting Involving Pipelines and the City's Right of Way, Roadway and Utility Infrastructure," attached to and incorporated in this Ordinance as though fully transcribed herein for all purposes.

Section 3. <u>Amendment of Ordinances</u>. Prior ordinances of the City dealing with or applicable to oil and gas pipelines are hereby amended to the extent of any conflict herewith, and all ordinances or parts thereof conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance as adopted and amended herein, are hereby amended to the extent of such conflict. In the event of a conflict or inconsistency between this Ordinance

and any other code or ordinance of the City, the terms and provisions of this Ordinance shall govern.

Section 4. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Tex. Loc. Gov't. Code.

Section 5. Severability. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are severable and, if any phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance should be declared invalid by the final judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation of this ordinance of any such invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

Section 6. <u>Open Meetings</u>. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act.

EXHIBIT "A"

Chapter 8, Building Regulations, Article VII, Building Regulations and Permitting Involving Pipelines and the City's Rights of Way, Roadway and Utility Infrastructure

8-250 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - General Technical Provisions.

- (1) The following provisions apply solely to natural gas transmission pipelines thirty (30) inches or larger interior diameter, built on or after the date of final passage of this Ordinance ("Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines" or "Pipelines") and any entities that may operate such Pipelines shall be identified herein as "Pipeline Operators."
- (2) As determined in the sole, but reasonable discretion of the City, Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines shall be located so that they do not interfere with or damage existing utilities, including but not limited to water, sewer, or gas lines, storm drains, electric lines or the facilities of any public utilities located in public rights-of-way, utility easements, municipal utility easements or other city-owned property or in private residential areas.
- (3) The Pipeline Operator shall be required to comply with pipeline permit requirements in Subsection 8-253 below and all regulations regarding noise in Subsection 8-254 below.
- (4) The Pipeline Operator shall be responsible to grade, level and restore the property affected by pipeline construction to the same surface condition, as nearly practicable, as existed before operations were first commenced within thirty (30) days after completion of the pipeline.
- (5) The city has control of roadways and facilities and/or lines existing within public rights- of-way, utility easements or on/under city owned property within the city, whether current or planned and the Pipeline Operator shall, unless pre-empted by state or federal law, design and build all Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines that will be on, over, under, along, across, within, or crossing public roads and/or all facilities and/or lines existing within the public rights-of-way, utility easements or on/under city owned property within the city limits shall be a minimum depth of thirteen (13) feet from top of pipe to surface, irrespective of the angle such Pipeline crosses such roads and/or all facilities and/or other lines existing within such rights-of-way, utility easements or on/under city owned property. "Planned roadways" include but are not limited to roads shown on approved preliminary plats, approved final plats, roads shown on CAMPO maps and any roadways shown on the City of Kyle's Comprehensive Plan and/or Transportation Plan. Planned roadways may include corridors. "Planned infrastructure" includes but is not limited to water/wastewater/stormwater lines shown on approved preliminary plats, approved final plats, shown on the City of Kyle's Comprehensive Plan, Master Plans, and/or Capital Improvement Plan.
- (6) At least sixty (60) days prior to finalization of any Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline construction plans, the Pipeline Operator and/or contractor shall provide the city with the construction plans for all Pipeline construction within the city to ensure that all current and future planned roadways have the Pipeline designed to the above-referenced depth.
- (7) At least ten (10) days prior to the commencement of any Pipeline construction, the Pipeline Operator shall give written mailed notice to all residents, tenants and property owners that are located adjacent to the proposed Pipeline. The mailing shall include the Pipeline Operator's publication on Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline safety.
- (8) At the time the required Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline records are submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas, the Pipeline Operator shall provide the city the following information, including GPS

information sufficient to locate the Pipelines in the future, including the beginning and end points of the Pipeline and sufficient points in between the Pipeline route and the depth of cover information. This information shall be submitted to the city in a format compatible with the city's own GIS system.

- a. As-built or record drawings of the Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines. Accuracy of the record drawings shall meet the City requirements as established by the City Engineer. The scale of the record drawings shall be a minimum of one inch to 40 feet. The drawings shall also be supplied in a DFF digital file format with the location tied to at least one nearby GPS (global positioning system) city monument. If the new Pipeline length exceeds 1,000 feet within the city, the Pipeline shall be tied to at least two GPS city monuments;
- b. The origin point and the destination of the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline;
- c. Confirmation of the substance to be transported;
- d. A copy of the substance material safety data sheet (MSDS);
- e. Engineering plans, drawings and/or maps with summarized specifications showing the horizontal location, covering depths and location of shutoff valves of the subject Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline. Drawings shall show the location of other pipelines and utilities that are crossed or paralleled within 15 feet of the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline right-of-way;
- f. Detailed cross-section drawings for all public rights-of-ways and utility easement crossings on city property as permitted by the city; and
- g. A list of the names and mailing addresses of all the property owners, residents and tenants adjacent to the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline construction.
- (9) At the time of permitting and each year thereafter that the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline remains active, each Pipeline Operator shall provide to the fire marshal and the chief of police the names, mailing addresses and telephone numbers of at least two primary persons, officers or contacts available on a 24-hour basis and at least two alternative persons, officers or contacts to be reached in the event that the primary contacts are unavailable who:
 - a. Can initiate appropriate actions to respond to an emergency;
 - b. Have access to information on the location of the closest shutoff valve to any specific point in the city; and
 - c. Can furnish the common name of the material then being carried by the Pipeline.

Any change in the above information must be provided to the city by contacting the city engineer prior to such change.

(10) Each Pipeline Operator shall file a copy of all initial or follow-up reports provided to the U.S. Department of Transportation or the Railroad Commission of Texas on unsafe Pipeline conditions, Pipeline emergencies or Pipeline incidents within the city concurrently with the city. In addition, such Pipeline Operator shall file any initial or follow-up reports filed with state and federal environmental regulatory agencies pertaining to Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline releases within the city concurrently with the city.

8-251 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Technical Provisions for Building Around Pipelines

- (1) In this section:
- (a) HAZARDOUS PIPELINE means a pipeline designed for the transmission of a hazardous liquid with an inside diameter of eight inches or more.
- (b) HAZARDOUS LIQUID means a liquid that is dangerous to human health or safety or the environment if used incorrectly or if not properly stored or contained. Pipeline safety regulations identify <u>petroleum</u>, petroleum products, or anhydrous ammonia as hazardous liquids. (Reference <u>49 CFR 195.2)</u>.

- (c) NATURAL GAS means natural gas, the principal constituent of which is methane. For purposes of this Ordinance, Natural Gas is not a Hazardous Liquid.
- (d) TRANSMISSION PIPELINE means large lines (greater than thirty (30) inches interior diameter) that move natural gas long distances around the country, often at high pressures (typically 200 1500 psi)
- (e) NEW CONSTRUCTION means the construction after August 31, 2019 of a structure intended for human occupancy, and includes the construction of a new structure, the construction of an addition to an existing structure and the reconstruction of a portion of an existing structure. The term excludes an addition to or the reconstruction or replacement of a structure existing on August 31, 2019 used for:
 - (i) single-family residential use;
 - (ii) small lot single-family residential use;
 - (iii) single-family attached residential use;
 - (iv) duplex residential use;
 - (v) two-family residential use;
 - (vi) mobile home residential use; or
 - (vii) in a neighborhood plan combining district:
 - (viii) cottage special use;
 - (ix) urban home special use; or
 - (x) secondary apartment special use.
- (f) RESTRICTED PIPELINE AREA includes an area within 25 feet of a Hazardous Pipeline or within 200 feet of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline.
 - (g) USE REQUIRING EVACUATION ASSISTANCE includes the following uses:
 - (i) congregate living;
 - (ii) convalescent services;
 - (iii) detention facilities;
 - (iv) day care services (commercial);
 - (v) hospital (general);
 - (vi) hospital (limited);
 - (vii) medical offices exceeding 5,000 square feet of gross floor area;
 - (viii) private primary educational facilities;
 - (ix) private secondary educational facilities;
 - (x) public primary educational facilities;
 - (xi) public secondary educational facilities; and
 - (xii) retirement housing (large site).
 - (2) Areas Involving a Use Requiring Evacuation Assistance
- (a) Subject to subsection (b) below, a Use Requiring Evacuation Assistance is prohibited in a structure intended for human occupancy that is located within 500 feet of a Hazardous Pipeline or within 500 feet of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline.
- (b) This prohibition does not apply to a structure that is located between 200 and 500 feet of a Hazardous Pipeline or a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline if by resolution the Council determines, after receiving a recommendation from the fire chief that
 - (1) the structure has a performance-based design that provides an adequate time period for occupant evacuation to a safe place in the event of a pipeline leak or fire associated with the pipeline, after considering:

- (a) the requirements of Chapter 25-12, Article 7 (*Uniform Fire Code*) and the 2000 edition of the National Fire Protection Association 101 Life Safety Code;
 - (b) the site and structure design;
 - (c) the structure's building materials;
 - (d) the structure's distance from the pipeline;
 - (e) the use of radiant energy barriers;
 - (f) access to the site and the structure by emergency responders;
 - (g) available on-site resources for emergency responders;
 - (h) the topography and other natural features;
 - (i) the use of the structure; and
 - (j) the evacuation capability of the occupants;
- (2) the structure incorporates a system for the early detection and notification of a pipeline leak, if the fire chief determines that an appropriate system is commercially available; and
- (3) the performance-based design for occupant evacuation and the early detection and notification system are certified and sealed by an engineer registered in Texas.

(3) Areas Involving New Construction

- (a) A person may not build New Construction within 200 feet of a Hazardous Pipeline or a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline unless:
 - (1) the fire chief determines that:
 - (i) the New Construction has a performance-based design that provides a minimum one-hour time period for occupant evacuation to a safe place in the event of a pipeline leak or a fire associated with the pipeline, in accordance with Chapter 25-12, Article 7 (Uniform Fire Code) or the 2000 edition of the National Fire Protection Association 101 Life Safety Code;
 - (ii) the New Construction incorporates a system for the early detection and notification of a pipeline leak, if the fire chief determines that an appropriate system is commercially available; and
 - (iii) the performance-based design for occupant evacuation and the early detection and notification system are certified and sealed by an engineer registered in Texas; or
 - (b) the New Construction complies with the standards for construction near a pipeline defined as a Hazardous Pipeline by the City of Austin, as prescribed by the Fire Protection Criteria Manual adopted by City of Austin.

(4) Areas Involving A Restricted Pipeline Area

- (a) Subject to subsection (b) below, A person may not place a structure or excavate within a Restricted Pipeline Area.
- (b) This prohibition does not apply to:
 - (i) the pipeline or an appurtenance;
- (ii) a facility that produces, consumes, processes, or stores the product transported by the pipeline, including a power generation facility;
- (iii) a public or private utility line (which may include but not be limited to water and wastewater lines, stormwater and/or drainage lines) that crosses the Restricted Pipeline Area, including an appurtenance to the line;
 - (iv) a utility service connection;
 - (v) a road;

- (vi) a surface parking lot; or
- (vii) a structure or excavation that the City and pipeline operator determines does not disturb the pipeline or impede its operation.
- (c) Before a person may place a road, surface parking lot, or utility line in a restricted pipeline area, the person must deliver to the City and pipeline operator a certification by a registered engineer stating that the proposed construction activity and structure are designed to prevent disturbing the pipeline or impeding its operation.

8-252 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Risk Reduction and Consultation

- (1) "Development Permit", for purposes of this consultation zone requirement, means any permit required by the city for activity that involves construction, grade modification, excavation, blasting, land clearing, or the deposit of earth, rocks or other materials that places an additional load upon the soil. Construction that involves work totally within an existing building footprint, such as residential remodeling projects, is specifically exempted from these consultation zone requirements.
- (2) Consultation Zone Distance. The consultation zone requirement applies to Development Permits involving any parcel that is within 660 feet of the centerline of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline. The 660 foot consultation zone distance may be lessened for certain Development Permit activities if notice of the Development Permit activities and the distance changes are provided to the Pipeline Operator(s) by the Development Permit applicant and no objection is provided by such Pipeline Operator. There must be written documentation demonstrating that such notice has been provided to the Pipeline Operator(s) and that within fifteen (15) days of delivery of such for such proposed Development Permit activities.. The intent of this section is to provide flexibility and to avoid unnecessary paperwork and delays in the permitting process while also making sure that all activities that may impact the integrity of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline are given an opportunity to be thoroughly reviewed by the Pipeline Operator(s). The fifteen (15) day time period may be extended so long as the Pipeline Operator(s) has contacted the applicant and requested such extension of time.
- (3) Consultation Zone Notification. Whenever any applicant applies for a Development Permit within the consultation zone established for Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines, the staff at the permit counter shall notify the applicant that they are within the consultation zone, explain the relevant application procedures, and provide contact information for the applicable Pipeline Operator(s). This same procedure shall be followed whenever an individual inquires about development regulations or zoning restrictions for property within the consultation zone.
- (4) Complete Application for Development Permit within Consultation Zone. A complete application for any Development Permit within the designated consultation zone must include written verification from the applicant that:
 - a) The applicant has delivered notice to the Pipeline Operator(s) and has provided the Pipeline Operator(s) with documentation detailing the proposed Development Permit activity and where the activity is to take place; and
 - b) That the Pipeline Operator(s) has either (i) responded with no objections, (ii) has failed to respond to the applicant within the fifteen (15) day time period set out above, or (iii) has provided objections to the applicant.

- c) The notice and written documentation shall be provided to the Pipeline Operator via both regular mail and certified, return receipt requested, and demonstrates that the Pipeline Operator(s) has received the documentation showing the proposed Development Permit activity and its location.
- d) If the Pipeline Operator(s) has responded, such documentation shall also be included.
- (5) Checklist. A checklist, provided by the City and submitted by an applicant for a Development Permit involving any parcel that is within 660 feet of the centerline of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline must reference the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline(s) and provide information concerning any impact the activity will have upon the integrity of the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline(s).

8-253 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - City Permit Required.

- (1) Prior to the construction and/or operation of Natural Gas through a Transmission Pipeline or Hazardous Materials through a Hazardous Pipeline as both are defined in 8-251 on or after the date of passage of this ordinance, the pipeline operator shall provide to the city certification that the design and installation of the Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline(s) or Hazardous Pipeline(s) meet all state and federal requirements. This certification is required for informational purposes only; the City does not assert authority to enforce these state and federal requirements.
- (2) Transmission Pipelines, Hazardous Pipelines, gathering lines and production lines within the city limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction where they are within, under, or touch City rights-of-way, roads, easements or any other city property shall be constructed in accordance with the city's ordinances.
- (3) The City may also require that a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline be redesigned or relocated should it conflict with the alignment and depth of a gravity dependent Proposed Utility Infrastructure.
- (4) Review by the City for all proposed Natural Gas Transmission Pipelines through private residential areas shall be required prior to the issuance of a pipeline permit for the commencement of Pipeline construction.
- (5) All known oil and gas pipelines, including Hazardous Pipelines and all private or public easements must be indicated on a plat.
- (6) Without express City Council approval, no Pipeline of any kind shall be permitted or installed in any right-of-way, road, easement or any other city property under each permit application in which another Hazardous Pipeline or Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline has been installed or approved for installation by the City.
 - (7) A pipeline permit application shall be required as follows:
- a. Applications for Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline, Hazardous Pipelines, or other activities regulated by Section 8-251 shall be submitted to the city in a form prescribed by the city.
- b. Plans submitted with each application for a pipeline permit shall be in a format approved by the city showing the dimensions and locations of the pipeline and related items or facilities, as well as all proposed lift stations, pumps or other service structures related to such pipeline and the location, type and size of all existing utilities, drainage, rights-of-way and roadway improvements. The plans must additionally show the elevation and location of all known public utilities within 15 feet of the centerline of the proposed pipeline. Any application that fails to meet these requirements will be returned as incomplete to the applicant.
 - c. The following information shall be provided in the application:
 - 1. The name, business addresses and telephone numbers of the pipeline operator;
 - 2. The names, titles and telephone numbers of the following:
 - i. The person signing the application on behalf of the pipeline operator; and

- ii. The person designated as the principal contact for the submittal.
- 3. The origin point and the destination of the proposed subject pipeline;
- 4. A text description of the general location of the proposed subject pipeline;
- 5. Identification of the substance to be transported through the proposed subject pipeline;
- 6. A copy of the substance material safety data sheet (MSDS);
- 7. Engineering plans, drawings and/or maps with summarized specifications showing the horizontal location, covering depths and location of shutoff valves of the proposed subject pipeline. To the extent that information can be obtained, drawings shall show the location of other pipelines and utilities that will be crossed or paralleled within 15 feet of the proposed subject pipeline right-of-way;
- 8. Detailed cross section drawings for all public street rights-of-way and public utility easement crossings;
 - 9. The proposed method or methods to be used for the installation of the pipeline;
 - 10. Methods to be used to prevent both internal and external corrosion;
 - 11. A binder of certificates of all bonds and insurance; and
- 12. A proposed alignment strip map showing name and address of all affected property owners.
 - (8) Fees associated with such pipeline permit(s) are as follows:
 - (a) *Pipeline permit application* fee. Every application for a pipeline permit shall be accompanied by a permit fee of \$2,500.00.
 - (b) *Pipeline right-of-way review*. Each pipeline permit application for use of a public right-of-way or public utility easement is subject to review and determination by the city's engineer or his/her designee.
 - (1) Permittees using the public right-of-way or a public utility easement shall enter into a city-approved use agreement with the city prior to receiving a pipeline permit authorizing the use of the city right-of-way or public utility easement.
 - (2) In the event a pipeline permit application for use of public right-of-way or a public utility easement is denied, an applicant may appeal such denial within five (5) days of receipt of written notice of such denial to the city manager. The decision of the city manager may be appealed to the City Council within five (5) days of receipt if the city manager's decision. The City Council's decision shall be final.
 - (c) Pipeline right-of-way annual use fee. Annual fee of \$3.00 times the number of rods of public ROW or public utility easements occupied. Payment for the first year is due within 30 days of approval and payment for subsequent years is due prior to each anniversary of the effective date of the agreement. This fee may, in the sole discretion of the city, be adjusted for inflation as long as the fee does not exceed the cost to the City of administering, supervising, inspecting, and otherwise regulating the location of pipelines occupying public rights-of-way and public utility easements.
 - (9) Insurance and Bonds.
 - (a) Each pipeline operator of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline or a Hazardous Pipeline during the term of its regulated pipeline permit must carry public liability insurance with a carrier rated "A" or better by A.M. Best in a minimum amount of \$1,000,000.00 for one person and \$5,000,000.00 for one accident and property damage insurance in the amount of \$10,000,000.00 for one accident.
 - (b) Each pipeline operator shall provide and maintain in full force and effect during the term of its regulated pipeline permit insurance with the following minimum limits:
 - (1) Worker's compensation at statutory limits.
 - (2) Employer's liability insurance with the following minimum limits for bodily injury by:
 - (a) accident, \$1,000,000 per each accident; and

- (b) disease, \$1,000,000 per employee with a per-policy aggregate of \$1,000,000.
- (3) Commercial general liability coverage, including blanket contractual liability, products and completed operations, personal injury, bodily injury, broad form property damage, operations hazard, pollution, explosion, collapse and underground hazards for \$2,000,000 per occurrence and aggregate policy limit of \$2,000,000.
- (4) Automobile liability insurance (for automobiles used by the pipeline operator in the course of its performance under the pipeline permit, including employer's nonownership and hired auto coverage) for \$2,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence.
- (5) Umbrella liability insurance following the form of the primary liability coverage described in Subsections (a) and (b) and providing coverage with minimum combined bodily injury (including death) and property damage limit of \$25,000,000 per occurrence and \$25,000,000 annual aggregate. Increased primary liability limits equivalent to the umbrella liability insurance limits specified will satisfy the umbrella liability insurance requirements.
- (c) <u>Performance bond or irrevocable letter of credit.</u>
- (1) Before issuance of a pipeline permit, the pipeline operator shall submit to the city a performance bond or irrevocable letter of credit approved as to form by the city attorney in the amount of \$100.000.
- (2) The performance bond is effective upon the issuance of the pipeline permit and must remain in full force and effect until all work under the terms of the pipeline permit has been completed.
 - (3) The performance bond may be amended to include other permitted pipeline permits.

8-254 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Noise

- (1) The Pipeline Operator of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline as defined in Section 8-251 shall submit a noise management plan detailing how the Pipeline or any equipment or facilities including compressor stations used in the installation of the Pipeline and/or, transportation of Natural Gas complies with the maximum permissible noise levels of this section. The noise management plan must:
 - a. Identify operation noise impacts;
- b. Provide documentation establishing the ambient noise level prior to construction of any pipeline; and
- c. 1. Detail how the impacts will be mitigated. In determining noise mitigation, specific site characteristics shall be considered, including but not limited to the following:
 - i. Nature and proximity of adjacent development, location and type;
 - ii. Seasonal and prevailing weather patterns, including wind directions;
 - iii. Vegetative cover on or adjacent to the site; and
 - iv. Topography.
- 2. The Pipeline Operator shall be responsible for verifying compliance with this section and the noise management plan after the installation of the noise generation equipment.
- (2) No Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline or any equipment or facilities including compressor stations associated with such pipeline shall be operated at any location within the city in such a manner so as to create any noise, that Exceeds 55dB(A) at the closest noise sensitive areas (i.e. homes, businesses, parks, churches, etc.)
- (3) The sound level meter used in conducting noise evaluations shall meet the American National Standard Institute's Standard for sound meters or an instrument and the associated recording and analyzing equipment which will provide equivalent data.

(4) A citation may be immediately issued for failure to comply with the provisions of this section. However, if the Pipeline Operator is in compliance with the approved noise management plan, and a violation still occurs, the Pipeline Operator will be given 24 hours from notice of noncompliance to correct the violation from an identified source before a citation is issued. Additional extensions of the 24-hour period may be granted in the event that the source of the violation cannot be identified after reasonable diligence by the operator.

8-255 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Coordination of Information Regarding Emergencies.

Upon discovery of a pipeline emergency or incident, any affected pipeline operator shall as soon as practical communicate to the city's 911 system the following information:

- a. A general description of the emergency or incident;
- b. The location of the emergency or incident;
- c. The name and telephone number of the person reporting the emergency or incident;
- d. The name of the pipeline operator;
- e. Whether or not any hazardous material is involved and identification of the hazardous material so involved; and
- f. Any other information as requested by the emergency dispatcher or other such official at the time of reporting the emergency or incident.

8-256 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Pipeline Repairs and Maintenance Involving the Public Rights-of-Way, Utility Easements or City owned Property

- (1) If non-emergency repairs necessitate excavation of a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline or Hazardous Pipeline in the public rights-of-way, utility easements, or City owned property, the pipeline operator shall send notification to occupants of business establishments and residential dwellings located adjacent to the pipeline to be excavated at least five (5) days prior to commencing such repairs.
- (2) If above-ground non-emergency repairs that are not routine maintenance are required and involve the public rights-of-way, utility easements or City owned property, the pipeline operator shall send notification to occupants of businesses and residential dwellings located within 200 feet from the centerline of the pipeline section to be repaired at least five (5) days prior to commencing such repairs.
- (3) The notice required herein shall be sent by United States regular mail, postage prepaid mailed at least five (5) business days prior to commencing any non-emergency repair; provided, however, that the pipeline operator may use hand delivery notice as an alternative, at the pipeline operator's discretion.

8-257 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - No Implied Grant of Use.

Nothing in this subsection grants permission for the use of any public street, public rights-of- way, utility easements or city-owned property. In the event a Pipeline Operator wishes to undertake any Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline construction on, over, under, along or across any public rights-of-way, utility easements or other city-owned property, the Pipeline Operator shall apply for and execute a written agreement with the city governing the terms and conditions for such use; obtain all required permits and comply with any other applicable provisions of the city code.

8-258 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - No Assumption of Responsibility by City; Responsibility.

Nothing in these provisions shall be construed as an assumption by the City of any responsibility of a pipeline operator of a pipeline not owned by the city.

8-259 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Public Awareness Information.

In keeping with the Natural Gas Pipeline Safety Act of 1968 and 49 CFR § 192.614, "Damage Prevention Program," 49 CFR § 192.615, "Emergency Plans," the Hazardous Liquids Safety Act of 1979, and 49 CFR § 195.408, "Communications," 49 CFR § 195.440, "Public Awareness," and the Community Right-to-Know Act, 40 CFR Parts 350-374, all as amended:

- (1) Annually, all pipeline operators will provide affected landowners, public officials and emergency providers with appropriate public awareness information as outlined in API 1162.
- (2) Each pipeline owner or operator shall maintain a public education program that is communicated to residents and business establishments within 1,000 feet of the centerline of a pipeline.
- (3) Public education information shall be communicated at least annually in both English and Spanish.

8-260 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Violations.

- (1) A person is criminally responsible for a violation of this article if the person:
 - (a) fails to obtain a City permit as required in 8-253 herein;
 - (b) fails to comply with the City's ordinances; or
 - (c) fails to comply with any provision of this article.
- (2) A person who knowingly violates any provision of this article is guilty of a separate offense for each day or portion of a day during which the violation is continued. Each offense is punishable by a fine of \$2,000. This fine shall be doubled for the second conviction of the same offense within any 24-month period and trebled for the third and any subsequent convictions of the same offense within any 24-month period.
- (3) To the extent that this Chapter 8, Building Regulations, refers to or incorporates any requirements of federal or state law, the violation of any such requirements of federal or state law shall not be subject to the provisions of this Section 8-260.

8-261 OIL AND GAS PIPELINES - Street and Right-of-Way Use.

- (1) In the event a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline is placed within any public right-of-way under the jurisdiction of the city, the owner/operator shall comply with the right-of-way use regulations as provided in this City's Code of Ordinance and obtain an appropriate franchise, permit or authorization for the use of such right-of-way.
- (2) To the extent that the provisions of this article conflict with the city's right-of-way use ordinance, this article shall apply.
- (3) All Right of Way Use Agreements that have been entered into and approved since September 10, 2019, are currently limited to a single pipeline in such Right of Way and such limitation shall not be removed or revised without City Council approval.

8-262 CERTAIN USES NEAR PIPELINES.

- (1) This section applies to a use that is nonconforming because of its proximity to a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline or Hazardous Pipeline under Sections 8-251 or 8-252.
- (2) Proximity to a Natural Gas Transmission Pipeline or Hazardous Pipeline does not solely cause a structure or area to be noncomplying under Article VII. Nonconforming Uses And Structures.
- (3) If there is a conflict between the regulations prescribed by this section and the regulations as determined by Article VII Nonconforming Uses and Structures, this provision controls.



REQUEST

The applicant requests a waiver to allow 50-foot wide rights-of-way (ROW) for the local, residential streets, internal to the subdivision.

LOCATION

The concept plan known as "Goforth Subdivision" consists of four hundred (400) residential lots, trails, parkland and amenity center. The property is zoned R-1-3. It's located on approximately 120-acres at the northwest corner of Bunton Creek Road & Goforth Road.



TEXT OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE

Sec. 41-137 – Streets (k)(1)

- (k) Pavement and right-of-way width.
 - (1) Minimum standards. All pavement widths referred to in the table in this subsection are from curb face to curb face. Where a range of pavement or right-of-way width is shown, such decision shall be made during the subdivision approval process. Direct access from abutting property to arterial streets and major thoroughfares will be restricted.

Standard Category	Pavement Width (in feet)	Right-of-Way Width (in feet)
Residential lane	28	60

ANALYSIS

The "Goforth Subdivision Concept Plan" was submitted to staff for review in late 2019. City staff knows of a significant number of easements --drainage, gas, overhead power, and water-- crossing the parcel at different locations and angles. In addition, there is a significant amount of flood plain that bisects the project, rendering even less land available for improvement.

The applicant/developer is working with staff to create a project that is successful, is code compliant, and meets the requirements & intent of the Residential Style Guide.

To help them make up for the large amount of undevelopable land, they're requesting a waiver to allow a 50' ROW vs. the minimally-compliant 60' ROW. Several other municipalities utilize 50'-ROW and San Marcos uses 53'-ROW. In some instances, the 50' width for ROW is even allowed inside the City of Kyle (Plum Creek, Paramount subdivision). Additionally, Planning, Engineering and Public Works are all amenable to the reduction in ROW width. Appropriate street design will be considered prior to the construction phase of the project.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff supports the request to reduce the project's ROWs from 60 feet to 50 feet and recommends its approval.


Mr. Koontz,

On behalf of the applicant for the Goforth Tract Subdivision, a 400-lot, approximately 120-acre single-family residential subdivision located at the northwest corner of Goforth Rd and Bunton Creek Rd, we respectfully request that the City of Kyle grant a waiver to Section 41-137 of the City of Kyle Code of Ordinances, which provides a minimum ROW width of 60' for residential lanes and local streets. The site is encumbered by a number of easements in both the lateral and longitudinal directions, limiting the available options for roadway and lot geometry. The use of a narrower ROW section provides a greater degree of freedom to arrange the subdivision such that these impediments can be avoided without significantly altering the natural topography of the site. That in turn provides greater freedom to utilize these non-residential areas and natural topographical features to provide park and trail systems for the residents, which would otherwise be limited by the site's geometric constraints.

We appreciate your taking the time to review this request, and look forward to working with the City of Kyle to develop a superior subdivision, meeting the needs and expectations of both the City and the eventual residents.
